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



idely considered country music's first superstar, Hiram "Hank" Williams was born September 17. 1923, in Mount Olive, Alabama. Growing up in a rural area and the third child of Lon and Lillie, Williams lived in a household that never had much money. With his dad working at a variety of jobs and continually moving the family, Williams felt isolated from his family and school mates. Being born with a spinal condition, spina bifida, separated him even more. His only solace seemed to be music. Picking up the guitar for the first time at the age of eight, he identified most with the musical sounds that poured out of the radio and emanated from church choirs. At the age of 13, he made his radio debut and shortly thereafter entered talent shows with his own band, Hank Williams and his Drifting Cowboys. Lillie supported Williams' musical aspirations and drove him and his band to shows throughout southern Alabama. By the early 1940s he'd caught the attention of music executives in Nashville. As his singing and songwriting abilities increased, so did his dependence on alcohol to relieve his sometimes excruciating back pain.

In 1943, he met singer Audrey Mae Sheppard, whom he eventually married and gave birth to their son. Hank Williams. Jr. in 1949. In 1946, Williams traveled to Nashville to meet with music publisher Fred Rose and the Acuff-Rose Publications Company and earned a record contract with the recently created MGM label. The following year he had his first hit, "Move It On Over" quickly followed by "Honky Tonkin." Williams became a regular on the Saturday Night Shreveport radio station program, Louisiana *Hayride*. His performances on the show greatly increased his name recognition, but it wasn't until his 1949 hit, "Lovesick Blues," that his sound really resonated with music fans and executives at the Grand Ole Opry in Nashville, who invited Williams to perform. In ways that must have

seemed unimaginable to this poor country boy, Williams' life quickly changed. His stardom put money in his pocket and gave him the kind of creative freedom artists long for. Over the next several years he churned out a number of other big hits, including: "Cold. Cold Heart." "Your Cheatin' Heart." "Hey Good Lookin'," "Lost Highway," and "I'll Never Get Out of This World Alive." He also wrote a number of religious songs under the pseudonym Luke the Drifter.

As his success deepened, so did Williams' dependence on alcohol and morphine. His physical appearance diminished and his hair began falling out. In late 1951, he suffered a minor heart attack while visiting his sister in Florida. A little more than a year later, on December 30, 1952, Williams collapsed in a hotel room in Knoxville, Tennessee. A doctor was called to examine him. Despite his physical failings, Williams was cleared for more travel. On New Year's Day 1953, he took his seat in the back of his 1952 powder blue Cadillac. As his driver barreled toward a concert venue in Ohio. Williams' abuse all those years finally took its toll. After not hearing from the singer for two solid hours, the driver pulled the car over in West Virginia at 5:30 in the morning. Williams was pronounced dead a short while later. His passing did not bring about the end to his stardom, however. In the years since his death, Williams' impact has only grown, with artists as varied as Perry Como, Dinah Washington, Norah Jones and Bob Dylan, all covering his work. Today Hank Williams is a member of the Country Music Hall of Fame. and in 2010 the Pulitzer Board awarded Williams a special citation for songwriting.

GROUND BREAKING Star Suites Actor's Village & Hotel

Riverside Theatre announces Star Suites by Riverside Theatre, a 60 one-bedroom suite facility created to accommodate out-of-town actors, designers, directors and artists that work or perform at Riverside Theatre. The project will include a center courtyard, clubhouse, and garden terrace for outside gatherings.

Currently, Riverside Theatre leases 25 apartments on a year-round basis to house artists, but with annual rental costs continuing to escalate rapidly, the Theatre has been looking for a permanent solution to cover its needs of over 10,000 room nights every year. LLW Architects, Inc. of Memphis has been selected as the architectural firm designing the facility with Kimley-Horn serving as the civil engineers and Proctor Construction as construction manager.

Funds are being raised now with a ground breaking expected to take place in November 2017. The facility will be completed by October 2018, in time for the start of the Theatre's 2018-2019 Season.

Star Suites by Riverside Theatre will be located on the corner of Aviation Boulevard and Flight Safety Drive, adjacent to Historic Dodgertown and less than a mile from the Vero Beach Regional Airport Terminal.

The Oktoberfest Celebration we know today. began on October 12, 1810, with the marriage of Crown Prince Ludwig of Bavaria and Princess Therese von Sachsen-Hildburghausen. A grand parade in front of the city gates was organized in honor of the newlyweds and the citizens of Munich were invited to join in the festivities. Continuing the celebratory atmosphere, horse races were added five days after the wedding.

In 1811, the festivities returned and were expanded with various exhibitions created to promote Bavarian agriculture. As the years progressed, the festival continued to grow in size and scope. Horse races were now accompanied by tree climbing competitions. carnival booths, arts performances, and of course, beer and wine tastings.

Today, Oktoberfest has grown into a two-week celebration of German beer, food, and entertainment with over 7,000,000 people attending last year's festivities in Munich.

Riverside Theatre joins the celebrations every weekend in October with fun-filled days showcasing German-style food and drink.







MAC BARNETT

Mac Barnett is a New York Times-bestselling author whose books for children have sold more than one million copies in the United States and have been translated into over 30 languages. His picture books include two Caldecott-Honor-winning collaborations with Jon Klassen: Sam & Dave Dig a Hole, which also won the E.B White Read-Aloud Award, and Extra Yarn, which won both the Boston Globe-Horn Book Award and the E.B. White Read-Aloud Award. Leo: A Ghost Story, illustrated by Christian Robinson, and The Skunk, illustrated by Patrick McDonnell, were named two of the Ten Best Illustrated Books of 2015 by The New York Times. Mac's novels include the Brixton Brothers mysteries and The Terrible Two series.

When did you know that you wanted to be a writer of children's books?

I wanted to be a writer when I was a kid, but I didn't know I wanted to write picture books until college. I was a counselor at summer camp, and when campers were exhausted, or overheated, or injured, it was my job to entertain them by making up stories. That was

my first audience—sweaty, crying four-year olds—and it was then that I figured out that kids were the best audience a writer can hope for

How important is having a semblance of truth in your stories?

If you mean realism—that the events in my stories happened or could happen—or honesty, in the sense that my narrators are trustworthy (even when those narrators are named Mac Barnett), then it's not important to me at all. But truth? Truth is paramount. I'm bending fictions in the attempt to get at some truth about what it means to be a person. That's the whole ballgame.

Award-winning novelist David Foster Wallace was your teacher and mentor. Although he wasn't a children's author, how did he help your writing literary fiction for kids?

Wallace was a great teacher. He had a big influence on my writing, and my life too. When I first applied to his fiction seminar, he winced and said, "I don't know anything about writing for kids," and I told him I didn't want to learn how to write for kids, I just wanted to learn how to write.

Why do you think kids are the best audiences for literary fiction?

Kids' minds are more plastic, and they're great at recognizing obscure patterns and learning new sets of rules, which is what literary fiction asks you to do. Childhood itself is experimental—it's only right that many children enjoy experimental literature.

Each of your books contain great illustrations. How involved is the illustrator in the story process?

With a few exceptions, illustrators usually come into the process after I've finished writing the text. But the story is not my words—the story is what happens when my words and an illustrator's pictures come together. And so the illustrations, and the illustrator, are essential to any of the picture books I've written.

What was your inspiration for *Leo, A Ghost Story?*

Leo was influenced by certain character-centered picture books from the mid-20th century, especially *Madeleine*. I wanted to take some of the storytelling principles from those classic books I loved and make a story that felt contemporary, too.

Is this your first book to be made in to a theatrical production?

It is!

What would you like the musical adaptation to convey to audiences?

I'm so impressed with the team who worked to make this musical, but what the play conveys is up to them (which is part of what makes the whole thing exciting to me).


