

This Tony Award-winning musical takes audiences back to December 4, 1956, when an extraordinary twist of fate brought Elvis Presley, Jerry Lee Lewis, Johnny Cash and Carl Perkins together in what became one of the most memorable nights in music. Based around that historical event, the musical recounts how these legends ended up in the same room at Sun Records in Memphis for one of the greatest impromptu rock 'n' roll jam sessions in history.

THE MOST FAMED JAM SESSION IN RECORDING HISTORY

n December 4, 1956, Carl Perkins, famous for the song "Blue Suede Shoes," was recording at Sun Records in Memphis. His pianist was the then unknown but already brilliant Jerry Lee Lewis, who had just started working at Sun. Before the two artists had finished their recording, Elvis Presley dropped by to see his friend Sam Phillips, who ran Sun Records. He was accompanied by a Las Vegas dancer who was visiting him. Elvis had worked at Sun until 1955, when Mr. Phillips sold Elvis' contract to RCA for \$35,000.

Elvis thought Perkins and Lewis sounded great, so he joined them for an impromptu jam session. Then Johnny Cash arrived, who had dropped by the studio in connection with his recording contract. The four artists were having a great time singing gospel songs, traditional songs and recent popular hits familiar to all of them. Sam Phillips recognized the publicity value of the jam session, and called the *Memphis Press-Scimitar* to have them write and photograph the session. The resulting article appeared the following day under the headline "Million Dollar Quartet."

The sound engineer working that day was impressed by the great music and unique quartet. He set up mics and started recording. The recordings couldn't be sold, because Elvis was under contract to RCA. When Sun Records was

sold in 1969, the tapes were licensed and catalogued in Europe. In 1981, 17 of the 47 tracks were released in Europe. A few years later, more tracks were found and released as *The Complete Million Dollar Quartet Session*. In 1990, the recordings were released in the United States as *Elvis Presley – The Million Dollar Quartet*.

In 2001, Floyd Mutrux and Colin Escott started working on a musical production chronicling that remarkable evening. Escott is the author of *Good Rockin' Tonight: Sun Records and The Birth of Rock & Roll*, which he updated several times after its publication in 1975. He also wrote and updated biographies on Hank Williams. Mutrux spent most of his career in Hollywood as a writer, director, producer and screenwriter.

Million Dollar Quartet had its world premiere at Seaside Music Theatre in Daytona Beach in November 2006. It subsequently played at two theatres in Washington State and Chicago before making it to Broadway in April 2010.

It was nominated for three Tony Awards including Best Musical, with Levi Kreis winning the Tony for Best Featured Actor in a Musical.



Dickens, *The Mystery of Edwin Drood* is a musical comedy with the book, music and lyrics written by Rupert Holmes. Dickens began publication of *Drood* in 1870 in episodic installments. However, with Dickens sudden death from a stroke that year, the novel was never finished and Dickens didn't leave any notes that would have resolved the mystery.

The premise of the show revolves around the murder of a young and charming man named Edwin Drood in Chesterham, England. But by whom? His leering romantic rival, John Jasper? The infamous purveyor of opium, Princess Puffer? The mysterious Landless twins who just arrived from Ceylon? Or some other dastardly villain?

Upon Dickens death and the publication of his final episode, various authors (including Dickens' own son) attempted to resolve the mystery with their own endings. Thus, many possible conclusions have been printed, including three film adaptations.

When Rupert Holmes was approached to write a musical for the New York Shakespeare Festival by impresario Joseph Papp, he chose to tackle *Drood*. But how do you adapt a story that has no ending? Taking inspiration from British pantomime and music hall styles, which reached their height of popularity during Dickens' time, Holmes took Dickens' story and set it as a "play within a play." The actors don't portray Dickens' characters, but music hall performers playing those characters. This concept allows Dickens' dark story to be lightened with comedy and audience interaction.

Holmes solved the 'ending' dilemma by writing various endings to the show and allowing the audience to vote at each performance which ending they preferred. This allowed different shows to have difference outcomes depending on audience votes. *Drood* was the first Broadway show to have multiple endings. After a highly successful run at the New York Shakespeare Festival in New York City in August 1985, *The Mystery of Edwin Drood* opened on Broadway in December 1985 and ran until May 1987.



Accomplished Musician, Writer, & Producer: RUPERT HOLMES

Rupert Holmes was born David Goldstein in Northwich, Cheshire, England in 1947. At the age of six, his family moved to a New York City suburb where Holmes continued to develop his musical prowess, eventually going to the Manhattan School of Music.

In 1969. Holmes was a record studio musician playing, producing, arranging and writing songs at many music sessions. He recorded a song with Ron Dante called "Jennifer Tomkins." which became a hit and was listed on the Billboard Hot 100 chart for 15 weeks. A follow-up single in 1970 also became a hit. Holmes' first album, Widescreen, in 1974, caught the attention of Barbra Streisand who asked to use some of his songs for her film, A Star is Born. As a solo artist. Holmes achieved great success with many other singles, but none were bigger than "Escape (The Piña Colada Song)," which was on the Billboard charts for 21 weeks and was the last number one song of the 1970s.

In 1996, Holmes created the television series "Remember WENN" for American Movie Classics writing the music and all 56 episodes of the show set at a 1940's radio station. With the success of *The Mystery of Edwin Drood*, Holmes went on to write other successful plays and musicals including: Say Godnight, Gracie; Accomplice; Thumbs; Marty; Swango, The Theatrical Dance; Curtains; The First Wives' Club; and The Nutty Professor, among others.

"Working on a proven show to deconstruct and rebuild it (with fewer actors and fully a third shorter!) with the original author is a rare treat for a director. I am very excited by the superb story structure as well as by colorful characters in *Drood*, each of whom has a specific written voice.



PLAYING LOMBARDI: RICHARD ZAVAGLIA

Arguably the most iconic and intensely competitive football coach of all time, Brooklyn, N.Y. born Vincent Lombardi of the NFL's Green Bay Packers inspired and transformed a demoralized team into winners, who won five championships in seven years, including the first Super Bowls played in 1966 and 1967. Lombardi's legendary desire to win and his unfailing quest for excellence in his players and himself was, as the play *Lombardi* reveals, "more than just the game."

The play is written by Wisconsin native Eric Simonson and is based on the book *When Pride Still Mattered: A Life of Vincent Lombardi* by David Maraniss. *Lombardi* debuted on Broadway in 2010 with Dan Lauria (of "The Wonder Years" TV fame) in the title role and Judith Light as Lombardi's wife Marie. The premiere was attended by NFL Commissioner Roger Goodell as well as several of Vince's former players who were featured as characters in the play. Moved by the retrospective portrayals of themselves and their beloved coach, the players were left in tears by the final curtain.

Richard Zavaglia, an actor, director, acting coach, artistic director and veteran of on- and off-Broadway productions, feature films, television series and commercials for 45 years (and a friend and colleague of Lauria), is preparing to step into the role of Vincent Lombardi. The Newark native shares Lombardi's Italian heritage and metro New York City roots as well as having played the same fullback position played by Lombardi during Vincent's years at Fordham University. Zavaglia's big break came with a role in Neil Simon's play *Chapter Two* on Broadway followed by featured roles in movies including *Going in Style* and *Donnie Brasco*.

which starred a young Johnny Depp. He recently starred with Lauria and Ray Abruzzo ("The Sopranos") in the off-Broadway run of *Dinner with the Boys* and spoke about portraying the football icon.

Like Lombardi, you know what it means to coach others. Is he someone you can almost naturally portray?

I find diamonds in the rough and it's exciting to mentor someone in acting. Yes, I definitely identify with Lombardi. We're Italian. I played fullback in high school like Lombardi did at Fordham (University). He originally wanted to be a priest and was taught by Jesuits who stress excellence.

What about Lombardi's relentless will to win and succeed?

Football was (just) what he did and eventually, I think it ate him up. He had ulcers, he drank, he smoked and he prepared for a game the entire week. He knew everyone's weaknesses and strengths. By the time the game came around, everyone knew exactly what to do and he may have been the least important person on the field by then. But I can understand that. You have to be single-handed.

You left a lucrative career as a hair salon owner in an upscale New Jersey community to pursue your childhood dream of acting. So you can relate to Lombardi-style focus and determination.

Some people have a "calling" and the only people who do this are people who have to do it. I identify with getting the best out of people and I think it comes from a higher power. I want to convey the complexity of Lombardi and his inner struggles. The humanity of him and his strive for perfection plus that unending quest for excellence even amid his flaws and failures. Lombardi prayed for patience and understanding at

Mass every morning. The play gives a feel of the guy and what his conflicts were in trying to be a good family man versus the need to win. He was a control freak.

The play debunks Lombardi's alleged "winning is the only thing" quote but underscores his passion for equality among team members during the dawn of the Civil Rights movement.

He understood prejudice. He was way ahead on that. He had been called a "wop" and long believed that he wasn't being offered a head coaching job because his last name ended in a vowel. But on the team they had to be equal: to win or lose as a team through pride, loyalty and focusing on goals.

You last appeared at Riverside Theatre in Breaking Legs during the 2008-2009 season. How is it to be coming back?

Failure was not an


