Patrick, her orphaned 10-year-old nephew, comes to live with her and she introduces him to an eccentric lifestyle and madcap cast of characters. When the stock market crashes and Mame loses her fortune, she tries, with comically disastrous results, to find a job for the first time in her life, but perseveres with humor and style. Jerry Herman's delightful score is packed with musical favorites "Bosom Buddies," "We Need a Little Christmas," "Open a New Window," "Mame," and more. Brimming with optimism and zest, Mame will make you laugh while warming your heart!

"Light the candles, Get the ice out, Roll the rug up. It's today!"

Written by Patrick Dennis, *Auntie Mame* is a book chronicling the madcap adventures of a boy who is brought up by the sister of his deceased father. The book, published in 1955, was an immediate hit and spent 112 weeks on *The New York Times* bestseller list. The book sold more than two million copies in its initial printing and was translated into five different languages. Dennis, whose real name was Edward Everett Tanner III, was inspired by his real life eccentric aunt, Marion Tanner. Aunt Marion's life and outlook are mirrored by Mame Dennis.

Mame is a wealthy, offbeat bon vivant. Living an arty, bohemian lifestyle in New York City in 1928, Mame's life changes when Patrick is orphaned and he comes to live with her. She includes Patrick in her fun-filled adventures, teaching him, "Life is a banquet and most suckers are starving to death." Their good life ends abruptly with the stock market crash of 1929. Mame comically and unsuccessfully tries to earn a living as an actress, operator and store clerk, but is rescued from her failures when she falls in love with a rich oil man. Patrick is sent to boarding school while Mame enjoys her new life with husband Beauregard. Mame and an adult Patrick are reunited once more after she becomes a wealthy widow. In 1956, the novel became a successful comedy on Broadway starring Rosalind Russell. An Academy Award nominated film version with

Ms. Russell reprising her role, was released at the end of 1958. The film became the top money-making film of 1959. The success of these endeavors led everyone to consider producing it as a musical.

Mame hit Broadway in 1966, with music and lyrics by Jerry Herman and story by Jerome Lawrence and Robert Edwin Lee, original writers of the 1956 play. Nominated for eight Tony Awards including Best Musical, Mame won awards for Angela Lansbury (Mame), Bea Arthur (Vera Charles) and Frankie Michaels (Patrick Dennis). With 1,508 performances over its four year run, Mame became one of Broadway's most successful musicals. Jerry Herman's music and lyrics were instrumental in the success of the musical. After his incredible hit with Hello Dolly in 1964, Mame was his second mega-hit. He followed that a few years later with another hit musical, La Cage aux Folles. A movie version of the musical starring Lucille Ball as Mame. Bea Arthur as Vera Charles and Robert Preston as Beauregard came out in 1974 with less than stellar results.

There have been several successful recordings of the songs from the musical. Eydie Gorme won the 1967 Grammy Award for Best Female Vocal Performance for her recording of "If He Walked into My Life." "We Need a Little Christmas," and "Mame" are hugely popular recordings by Louis Armstrong, Bobby Darin and Herb Alpert.



MEET PLAYWRIGHT LUCAS HNATH

Author Lucas Hnath grew up in Orlando and moved to New York City in 1997 to study pre-med. He changed to dramatic writing at the Tisch School of the Arts at New York University earning a BFA in 2001 and an MFA in 2002. He teaches at New York University and is a resident playwright at New Dramatists.

His plays include *Red Speedo*, which won the 2016 Abie Award for Playwriting, *The Christians, A Public Reading of an Unproduced Screenplay About the Death of Walt Disney, Isaac's Eye,* and *Death Tax.* His work has been produced at Actors Theatre of Louisville/Humana Festival of New Plays, Ensemble Studio Theatre, Gate Theatre, Mark Taper Forum, New York Theatre Workshop, Playwrights Horizons, Royal Court Theatre, Soho Rep, and Victory Gardens.

He has received the Kesselring Prize, a Guggenheim Fellowship, the Whiting Award, two Steinberg/ATCA New Play Award Citations, and an Outer Critics Circle Award for Best New Play. His play *The Christians* was produced at the Humana Festival in 2014 and premiered Off-Broadway at Playwrights Horizons in 2015. The play was nominated for two 2016 Drama Desk Awards and 2016 Lortel Awards and won the 2016 Outer Critics Circle Award for Outstanding New Off-Broadway Play. His new play, *A Doll's House, Part 2*, which picks up where Henrik Ibsen's *A Doll House* concludes, will premiere on Broadway at the John Golden Theatre this April. This will mark Mr. Hnath's Broadway debut.



aturday Night Fever burst onto the American scene as a 1977 movie starring John Travolta. The film made Travolta an icon, and revived disco music to new heights around the world. The story is based on an article written by Nik Cohn for New York Magazine, "Tribal Rites of the New Saturday Night." Nik subsequently admitted that he made up the article, but he captured the mood of the hour. America was reeling from the failures of Vietnam and Watergate. It had endured a major oil crisis in 1975, and was in the midst of the deepest recession in forty years.

The story is set in Bay Ridge, Brooklyn. Tony Manero is stuck in a dead end job at a hardware store, but he lives for the weekends when he is a star dancer at the Odyssey Disco. The screen play of the R-rated movie was written by Norman Wexler. It featured many dark themes such as drug use, racial conflict, sexual promiscuity and violence. However the depiction of white suits, platform shoes, bell bottom pants and disco life brought joy to people stuck in dead end jobs like Tony's. Subsequent film and stage versions of the show de-emphasized the darker aspects of the Wexler's original screenplay.

Norman Wexler was a noted screenwriter who also wrote *Serpico* and *Joe*. He suffered from bi-polar disorder, which probably accounted for his ability to portray Tony's wildly divergent experiences of a boring job interspersed with exuberant weekend dancing competitions. The music and lyrics by the Bee Gees were instrumental in revitalizing and globalizing disco music. The distinctive sound of Barry Gibbs' falsetto voice became one of the transformative themes of their long career. They sold over 220 million records, making them sixth in world record sales. The sound track of *Saturday Night Fever* sold over 40 million copies and won five Grammy Awards.

- Push wheelchairs and walkers
- Hear in crowded conditions
- React instantly to an emergency situation

A TRIBUTE TO JASON EDWARDS

Director, Musician, Actor

It is with great sadness Riverside Theatre shares the news of the passing of Jason Edwards, star and director of the just concluded run of Ring of Fire, The Music of Johnny Cash. "The theatre community has lost a unique talent," said Allen D. Cornell, Producing Artistic Director/CEO of Riverside Theatre. "My relationship with Jason goes back over twenty years as both a professional colleague and friend. We loved to shoot the breeze about fishing as much as how to create indelible moments on the stage. On his final day here among us, he caught a nice redfish on a special topwater plug I had given him a week or so ago. He played his last chords on his six string here on the Riverside stage, and they will long be remembered."

An accomplished director, musician, and actor, Mr. Edwards had an affinity for Mr. Cash. "We are cut from the same cloth." Mr. Edwards said.

"We were Southern boys who grew up on farms, singing hymns in church, aspiring towards the same thing. When I was 13 years old, I had the chance to see him in concert. The power and

underneath that image and fame was a very patriotic American and deeply spiritual man. Throughout his life he never lost sight of who he was and where he came from." Mr. Edward's dedication to Ring of Fire took him all over the country where he directed and performed Mr. Cash's music to tens of thousands of theater patrons. Lauded by critics and audiences alike, Riverside Theatre's production of Ring of Fire became the most successful opening show in the Theatre's 43 year history.

Having performed at Riverside twice before, Pump Boys & Dinettes and A Sanders Family Christmas, Mr. Edwards loved Vero and spent his last days fishing and enjoying the area. Riverside Theatre extends its condolences to Mr. Edward's family, friends, and fans.

Riverside Theatre's Nightlife experiences are the perfect destination for the whole family.









Director KEVIN QUILLINAN This Spring, our students are tackling their biggest challenge as they perform *A Midsummer Night's Dream*, our final Student Series show for this season. The plays of William Shakespeare are daunting for any actor no matter how much experience they have. *Midsummer* is one of his most popular and performed plays for a good reason – it's very accessible and funny. There is something about the silliness of this story that has sparked imaginations for centuries.

I have long wanted us to offer more Shakespeare for our students. Since it has been a while, I figured *A Midsummer Night's Dream* would be an excellent starting point since most of our students have had little to no experience with the Bard. Shakespeare is rightfully seen as a challenge because of the barriers of the Elizabethan language and the iambic pentameter. When I was first acquainted with Shakespeare in school, I was fortunate to have wise teachers, who knew that his works should not be merely studied as literature; they were written to be performed. There is a magic that happens when speaking the lines aloud: you get the feeling and understanding of the stakes of the story.

We've taken liberties with the show by setting it in the mid-1960s to help it resonate even more with the kids. The fun and funky styles of that era will help the students see the material in a whole new light, and make some of the play's themes of rebellion, love, and trickery stand out even sharper amid the bright colors and fashions of the era. We eagerly anticipate making the Anne Morton Stage

a little more colorful flowery both in setting and language this April!
