

Closer Than Ever is a contemporary musical revue featuring the music and lyrics of David Shire and Richard Maltby Jr. Their collaborative work has been successful on Broadway and stages the world over, however, their individual accomplishments are probably better known. Shire has gained recognition writing film scores like "All the President's Men" and Maltby working on shows like Miss Saigan. Closer Than Ever is filled with twenty-four funny, wise, and witty songs about relational experiences we all share.

A year's worth of planning has gone into the productions highlighted in this issue of the Back Stage Pass. I hope you are as excited as we are to see them come to life on our stage.





as Emile de Becque

American bass-baritone David Pittsinger is renown as a stage performer of the greatest distinction. He garnered critical praise for playing the role of Emile de Becque in the Lincoln Center revival of South Pacific in 2008. Having appeared on the world's leading opera and concert stages in Vienna, Salzburg, Brussels, Paris, Tanglewood, Pesaro, New York, Santa Fe, Cincinnati, Los Angeles, and San Francisco, he is equally at home in baroque through contemporary operas, as well as musical theater. His vocal range and color are exceptionally wide-ranging, enabling him to perform a variety of repertoire and styles.

Performing in four Live HD broadcasts from the Metropolitan Opera, Mr. Pittsinger appeared as Comte des Grieux in Manon with Anna Netrebko, Le Spectre in Hamlet, Angelotti in Tosca and The Speaker in the Julie Taymor production of The Magic Flute, as well as the roles of Colline, Truelove and Achilla.

Recent role debuts include Roy Disney in Philip Glass' world premiere of The Perfect American at Madrid's Teatro Real. Upcoming debuts include Jochanaan in Salome by Strauss at Portland Opera and Marquis in Les Dialogues des Carmelites by Poulenc at the Metropolitan Opera.

Signature roles include the title role in Boito's Mefistofele, Mephistopheles in Gounod's Faust, The Villains in Les Contes D'Hoffmann, the title role in Massenet's Dan Quichotte, the title role in Don Giovanni, the roles of Figure and Count Almaviva in Le Nazze di Figaro, Nick Shadow in The Rake's Progress, Scarpia in Tosca, and Escamillo in Carmen.

Recent career highlights include creating the role of Eugene O'Neill in the world premiere of Jeanine Tessori and Tony Kushner's A Blizzard On Marblehead Neck at Glimmerglass Festival; making history by performing in The Met's Hamlet and on Broadway in Lincoln Center Theater's production of South Pacific in the same day; receiving the Helen Hayes nomination for "Best Leading Actor" as Emile de Becque in South Pacific (LCT National Tour | Kennedy Center); and appearing before the Supreme Court in a musicale for the Supreme Court Justices.

A Connecticut native and graduate of UCONN and the Yale School of Music, Mr. Pittsinger received the University of Connecticut School of Fine Arts Alumni Award in 2006. He resides on the Connecticut shoreline with his wife, soprano Patricia Schuman, and his twin children Maria and Richard.

A graduate from Oklahoma City University with an MM in Music Theatre, Heather has had starring roles in various productions including: Miss Saigon, Grease, Tarzan, Into The Woods, A Christmas Carol, Rapunzell Rapunzell, Call me Madam, and Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat. She has studied voice with Florence Birdwell, Jan McDaniel, and Joyce Guyer; acting with Jen Waldman, Mark Price, and Karen Miller; and is proficient in all forms of musical theatre dance.





JAMES MICHENER

Author of TALES OF THE SOUTH PACIFIC

The stories brilliantly portrayed life in wartime: the waiting, selfless heroism, endless toil, vast and meticulous

Michener's novels sold over 75 million copies worldwide. He was extremely generous with his earnings, donating \$100,000,000." Among the beneficiaries were the University of Texas, the lowa Writers Workshop, and Swarthmore College. With the royalties of the novel Journey he established the Canadian Journey Prize, \$10,000 awarded annually for the best short story by an emerging author.

Michener was married three times. His third marriage, to Mari Yoriko Sabusawa, lasted for 39 years until her death in 1994. He died in 1997 at the age of 90 after years of kidney disease. He is buried next to Mari in Austin, Texas.

planning and logistics of a campaign, and the suddenness of death, loss and love. The story of Liat and U. Cable was based on Michener's encounter with a young marine from Alabama. The marine had married and had a child with a local Tonkinese woman, and was terrified to face the reaction of his bigoted family in Amer-ica. He begged to stay and fight the Japonese fleet instead of going home.




James Michener is best known for writing over 40 books, mostly sweeping multi-generational family sagas set around the world. He is noted for his meticulously researched historical facts, and cultural and geographical details. His novels, many of which were over 1,000 pages, include Tales of the South Pacific, Hawaii, Chesapeake, Carribean, Alaska, Texas, Poland, Caravans, The Drifter and The Source

He was born in 1907 and raised as a Quaker in Doylestown, Pennsylvania by his adaptive mather, Mabel Michener. He wrote that he had no knowledge of his biological parents or exactly when he was born. He attended Swarthmore College, where he graduated Phi Beta Kappa and summa cum laude. He pursued a master's degree in education from Colorado State Teachers College, and taught there for several years after graduation. In 1940, he taught at Harvard for one year prior to joining Macmillan Publishers as a social studies editor.

In 1942, he was called into the Navy and served as a Lieutenant Commander in the South Pacific. He received assignments as a naval historian because his base commanders mistakenly thought he was the son of Admiral Mitscher. It was this work that led to his first novel, Tales of the South Pacific, published in 1947, and winner of the Pulitzer Prize in 1948. In 1949, the novel was adapted as the musical South Pacific by Rod gers and Hammerstein.

Tales of the South Pacific was a series of sequential short stories, based on Michener's experiences serving in World War II. He served as a naval Lieutenant Commander on the island of Vanuatu, then known as Espiritu Santo Island in New Hebrides, Michener worked as a naval historian, so he was able to observe the big picture throughout his war service

History of South Pacific

Composed by Richard Rodgers, with lyrics by Oscar Hammerstein II and book by Hammerstein and Joshua Logan, South Pacific premiered on Broadway in 1949 and was an immediate hit, running for over 4.5 years and 1,925 performances. When South Pacific closed in 1954, it was the second longest running musical in Broadway history. The only show to have run longer at this point was Rodgers and Hammerstein's Oklahoma!

The musical, based on James A. Michener's 1947 book Tales of the South Pacific, primarily combines elements of two of the stories. Rodgers and Hammerstein believed that they could write a musical that would be financially successful and, at the same time, would send a strong message on racism.

Rodgers and Hammerstein set the musical in the Solomon Islands and combined the storylines of "Fo Dollah", about Bloody Mary, Liat, and Lieutenant Cable; and "Our Heroine," which was the story of Emile de Becque and Nellie Forbush. When the stories were adapted for the musical, the characters and details were merged and simplified for the stage. The stories were also modified in deference to mid twentieth century mores. As an example, in the book, Emile fathered eight mixed-race children from four different women, none of whom he married. In the musical, Emile had two mixed-race children from one wife who died.

The plot centers on an American nurse, Nellie Forbush, stationed on a South Pacific island during World War II who falls in love with a middle-aged French plantation owner, Emile de Becque, but struggles to accept his mixed-race children. The romance between a U.S. officer, Lieutenant Cable, and a young Tonkinese woman, Liat, also explores the difficulties of cultural differences as Lieutenant Cable fears the social consequences should he marry his Asian sweetheart. The issue of racial prejudice is candidly explored throughout the musical, but most poignantly expressed in the song, "You've Got to Be Carefully Taught."

The original Broadway production, starring Mary Martin as Nellie and Ezio Pinza as Emile, enjoyed immense critical and box-office success earning over \$1,000,000 in ticket sales days after the show opened. After they signed Pinza and Martin as the leads, Rodgers and Hammerstein wrote several of the songs with the particular talents of their stars in mind.

Winner of the 1950 Pulitzer Prize for Drama, South Pacific had an equally successful five year tour throughout the United States, but provoked controversy in the South because of its racial theme, for which its authors were unapologetic.

The Broadway production won 10 Tony Awards, including Best Musical, Best Score and Best Libretto, and is the only musical to win Tony Awards in all four acting categories. The original cast album was the best-selling record of the 1940s. The show has enjoyed many successful revivals and tours, spawning a 1958 film starring Rossano Brazzi and Mitzi Gaynor, and various television adaptations. The 2008 Broadway revival, was a commercial and critical success winning seven Tonys, including Best Musical Revival.



David Shire

Closer Than Ever's delightful songs deal with love, happiness, aging, and life's challenges. Many of the songs are based on real life experiences and stories told through the music and lyrics of David Shire and Richard Maltby, Jr. The songs came from a portfolio campiled by Richard Maltby beginning in 1984, called the Urban File. Urban File contained songs cut from other musicals, musical ideas, philosophical observations, and biographical details

Closer Than Ever originated as a cabaret act, Next Time Now, which had a successful run at the Greenwich Village nightclub, Eighty-Eights. The work was a critical success with both the public and critics, and Maltby and Shire decided to expand this product into a full evening-length show.

The full-scale version of the show went through a trial run at the Williamstown Theatre Festival in Massachusetts during the summer of 1989. Marcia Milgrom Dodge, who has directed a few productions at Riverside, was hired to choreograph the expanded show. Well received by audiences, the show headed for New York City. Closer Than Ever opened at the Off-Broadway Cherry Lane Theatre in 1989, and ran for 312 performances. It won the Outer Critics Circle Award for the Best Off-Broadway musical as well as garnering Drama Desk nominations for Maltby and Shire.

The show has played at theaters across the country and had its London premier at the Bridewell Theatre in 2006. A recent Off-Broadway revival was well received by The New York Times and The New Yorker

Richard Maltby, Jr. was born in Ripon, Wisconsin in 1937, son of Virginia and Richard Maltby, Sr., a well known band leader. He is a director, producer, screenwriter, and constructor of cryptic crossword puzzles. He conceived and directed the only two musical revues to win Tony awards: Ain't Misbehavin' in 1978 and Fosse in 1999. He was co-lyricist for Miss Saigon.

David Shire was born in Buffalo, New York in 1937. He was the son of a well known society band leader. He attended Yale University where he met Richard, and to two have collaborated on theatrical projects ever since.

Shire scored many feature films including All the President's Men. The Hindenburg. The Taking of Pelham One Two Three, and Zodiac. He composed the original music for Saturday Night Fever. Shire and Norman Gimbel received an Academy Award for "It Goes Like It Goes," the theme song for Norma Rae. His songs have been recorded by Barbra Streisand, Pearl Bailey, and Johnny Mathis.

Retired General (Dr.) Robert Scales is one of America's best known and most respected authorities on land warfare. Immediately after retirement from the Army, he was appointed President and CEO of Walden University. He is currently President of Colgen, Inc., a consulting firm specializing in issues relating to landpower, wargaming and strategic leadership.



Prior to joining the private sector, Dr. Scales served over 30 years in the Army, retiring as a Major General. He commanded two units in Vietnam, winning the Silver Star for action during the battles around Dong Ap Bia (Hamburger Hill) during the summer of 1969. Subsequently, he served in command and staff positions in the United States, Germany, and Korea and ended his military career as Commandant of the United States Army War College. In 1995, he created the Army After Next program which was the Army's first attempt to build a strategic game and operational concept for future land warfare. He has written and lectured on warfare to academic, government, military, and business groups in the United States and ground the world.





As the first professional show of composer Stephen Schwartz, it contains many classic songs like "Day by Day" and "Prepare Ye the Way of the Lord." Based on the Gospel according to Matthew, this is a fun and inventive approach to the stories and parables of Jesus.

This JR adaptation contains song keys that suit younger voices and runs for only an hour, which is friendlier to younger attention spans! Whereas the original show was performed by only nine actors, Godspell JR has been adapted to include many more performers, which is important for our program, since RCT strives to introduce the joys of performing to as many students as we can.

With a big cast and wide age range, from 8 through 18, RCT strives to present shows as polished as possible. Our shows are a great way for our students to work together and build off the talents of both new and seasoned performers. Some of our talented cast members are choreographing a few songs. 
