Born María Eva Duarte in 1919, in rural Argentina, Eva Perón grew up poor with dreams of becoming a famous actress. When her father died in a car accident in 1926, her family's financial struggles worsened and they were forced to move to a small town near Buenos Aires where her mother and older siblings took various jobs.

At the age of 15, Eva moved to Buenos Aires and found work with a number of theater companies. By the time she was 20 years old, she had started her own entertainment business, which produced radio programs.

When she met Juan Perón at a benefit for earthquake victims in 1944, her life changed dramatically. A powerful colonel and government official, Perón was immediately taken by Eva's beauty and sophistication. A year after their marriage in 1945. Perón won a landslide victory and became president of Argentina. A skilled speaker. Eva used her position as first lady to fight for causes she believed in, including women's suffrage and improving the lives of the poor.

Eva died of cancer one month after her husband's second inauguration in 1952 and was given a funeral fit for a head of state.

This story of a poor girl who became a prominent political power has been the subject of countless books, films and plays. On September 25, 1979. Tim Rice and Andrew Lloyd Webber's smash hit Broadway musical *Evita* opened at the Broadway Theatre and closed on June 26, 1983 after 1,567 performances. The show was nominated for 11 Tony Awards® winning 7 including Best Musical, Best Score (Tim Rice and Andrew Lloyd Webber), Best Leading Actress (Patti LuPone), Best Featured Actor (Mandy Patinkin), and Best Direction of a Musical (Hal Prince).

## **Q & A** with *Evita* Director Marcia Milgrom Dodge

Tony® Award-nominated director-choreographer Marcia Milgrom Dodge returns to Riverside to direct and choreograph our production of Evita. Her work as a director and choreographer has been seen throughout the United States, in

Canada, England, Asia, Denmark and the Middle East, in theatres on Broadway, Off-Broadway, at acclaimed regional theatres. Dodge's work has won the Helen Hayes, Carbonell, Los Angeles Drama Critics. New York Outer Critics Circle and Daytime Emmy Awards and she has been nominated for the Tonv®. Drama Desk. Astaire. Drama League, Barrymore and Edgar Awards. She is a teacher, a wife, a mother, a proud executive board member of the Stage Directors & Choreographers Society and a published and produced playwright.

How would you describe the show?

Marcia Milgrom Dodge (MMD): My description of Evita is best described by 2 sources. First, The Musical Company describes Evita as "charting the young and ambitious Eva Peron's meteoric rise to sainthood." And second, as Scott Miller writes about Evita in his analysis of the musical, "It's about storytelling. It's about truth versus perceived truth. It's about the public perception of political movements and radical social

change. Underneath, it's about the childhood damage that drives some people to great heights, for better or worse."

MMD: When I work on revivals, I dig into

#### What in the story appeals to you?

the characters and relationships resulting in intimate rather than epic storytelling. With this production of Evita, we are embarking on a storytelling approach that will illuminate Eva's motives. in. what I hope will be, a very empathetic way.

She died a very young age. Why do you think there is still so much interest in her story? MMD: Human beings are fascinat-

ed by mysteries and icons and many icons are fascinating beings who ascend to fame rapidly and then die young or under mysterious circumstances. Eva Perón remains fascinating because her ascent was swift and her motives were never truly understood.

#### Having previously directed at Riverside. what experiences would you like Vero audiences to take from the show?

MMD: Having never directed Evita, I hope the audience engages in Eva's story with wonder, fascination, excitement, danger and passion like an Argentine Tango.



Tim Rice and Andrew Lloyd Webber are legends in the world of musical theatre. While each have been involved with the most popular musicals of the modern era, Rice and Lloyd Webber only collaborated on six shows together. Their first show, The Likes of Us, first written in 1965, was not produced until 2005. They followed The Likes of Us with three powerhouses: Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat, Jesus Christ Superstar, and Evita. They collaborated on a show, Cricket, commemorating the 60th birthday of Queen Elizabeth II in 1986 and created four new songs in 2011 for a musical production of The Wizard of Oz. which also included songs from the classic film written by Harold Arlen and E.Y. Harburg. Mr. Rice has written the lyrics for Chess, Beauty and the Beast, The Lion King, Aida, Aladdin, and more. Mr. Lloyd Webber has composed music for Cats, Starlight Express, The Phantom of the Opera, Aspects of Love, Sunset Boulevard, School of Rock, and others.

# One family is about to face the music. next to NORMAL

Winner of three Tony Awards® and the 2010 Pulitzer Prize for Drama, this contemporary musical tells the story of a seemingly normal suburban household - Dad's an architect, Mom's a diligent housewife, and the kids are bright, wise-cracking teens. Yet, their lives are anything but normal due to Mom's mental illness. An emotionally powerful production, Next to Normal takes audiences into the hearts and minds of each character and presents one family's story with love, sympathy and compassion.

Music by Tom Kitt Book and Lyrics by Brian Yorkey he contemporary musical, *Next to Normal*, chronicles the emotional toll on a family that is forced to come to terms with their past and face their future as the mother suffers from depression. While mental illness is not standard Broadway fare, *Next to Normal* not only managed to garner critical acclaim but also attained commercial success on Broadway and on national tours.

What began as a 10-minute class project at the BMI Lehman Engel Musical Theatre Workshop between Brian Yorkey and Tom Kitt about electroconvulsive therapy, turned into a show that won three 2009 Tony Awards® and the 2010 Pulitzer Prize for Drama.


"We've known and loved people who have struggled with depression – as so many people have," said composer Tom Kitt in an interview with *DC Theatre Scene*. "The show is formed by many of these experiences, and also by a great deal of research and reading of other first-person accounts."

Mostly sung through, with some dialogue, *Next To Normal* is filled with emotionally powerful songs. The award-winning score incorporates dynamic rhythms and orchestrations to showcase the struggles this family faces, but also the reconciliation and hope everyone strives to attain.

Next To Normal opened at the Booth Theatre on Mach 27, 2009 and closed on January 16, 2001 after 754 performances.

Honoring excellence in journalism and the arts since 1917, the Pulitzer Prize for Drama recognizes theatrical work staged in the United States during a preceding calendar year. While not necessarily awarded every year, 87 awards have been issued to both plays and musicals during its inception. Many of the plays awarded have become classics in the theatre world including: Our Town, A Street Car Named Desire, The Death of a Salesman, Picnic, Cat on a Hot Tin Roof, Diary of Anne Frank, Long Day's Journey Into Night, The Gin Game, Driving Miss Daisy, Lost in Yonkers, Angels in America, Wit, Proof, and Doubt, to name a few. Only nine musicals have won the award including: South Pacific, A Chorus Line, Rent, Hamilton and Brian Yorkey & Tom Kitt's Next To Normal

Play by Joe DiPietro

laywright Joe DiPietro graduated with a degree in English from Rutgers University in 1984 and planned on attending law school at the University of California at Los Angeles. Shortly before he was to leave, he was offered a job with the sports division of CBS. He stayed for a decade, rising to the position of advertising copywriter while also cultivating his interest in theater. At the suggestion of a friend, DiPietro started writing comic sketches and very short dramatic scenes for a theater company in New York. "Through sketch writing, I learned what was funny," DiPietro told *The New York Times*. "I learned the ropes. I was getting better, and I still had a great day job at CBS."

In 1996, DiPietro's first produced work, I Love You, You're Perfect, Now Change, opened at the Westside Theatre Off-Broadway and ran for twelve years, becoming the second longest-running Off- Broadway musical behind The Fantastics. He followed that production in 1998 with the comedy Over The River And Through The Woods. which played the John Houseman Theatre and ran for over two years. DiPietro's work made its Broadway debut in 2005 with the Elvis Presley jukebox musical All Shook Up. In 2010, DiPietro and David Bryan, from the rock group Bon Jovi, wrote Memphis, which played Riverside Theatre in 2015. Memphis won the 2010 Tony Award® for Best Musical and ran at the Shubert Theatre for over three years.

Some critics have said DiPietro's plays were mainstream. "Well, that's kind of where I'm from, and, that's the kind of people I know and enjoy," he said. "For whatever reason, my plays tend to strike a universal chord. My characters are real people, they're functional people." Set in a public dog-run in Hoboken, New Jersey, the main characters in *The Last Romance* are older individuals still looking to enjoy life and fulfill dreams. However, they struggle with competing claims of family responsibility and self-fulfillment. "I've met these people," DiPietro says. "Coming from a strong Italian-American family, I know dreams don't die, nor should they ever."

It's the Friendly touch that makes Riverside a special asset to the community. Without Friends, Riverside Theatre, as we know it today, could not exist.









But that is just a small part of the weekend, which brings in many renowned theatre performers, composers,
